Who: Children Grades 3-8—Limited Class Size

This class teaches flexibility, balance, strength, rhythm and agility. Your child will develop a keener sense of body awareness and coordinated movement with the help of their care giver. This class is designed to build motor skill development in a fun filled environment with movement, music, and games with the use of props. Parent/Care Giver will be expected to participate and act as role model.

This eight week course will introduce the students to acting, singing, dancing, and the world of musical theater. They will focus on learning the terminology of the theatre, creating a character, vocalization, creative writing, and choreography. For the acting segment of this class, we will focus on improvisation as we free each actor of their inhibitions. Acting is important for children of all ages, as it strengthens their self-esteem. At the end of the eight week course we will have an informal showing of the work we have accomplished.
